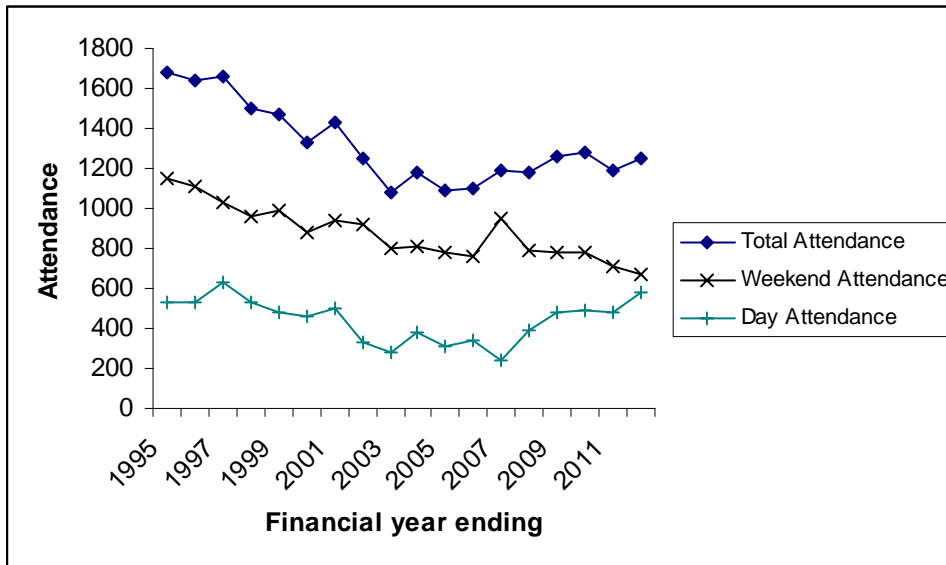

It's good to see the high number of walks out. **Thank-you leaders.**

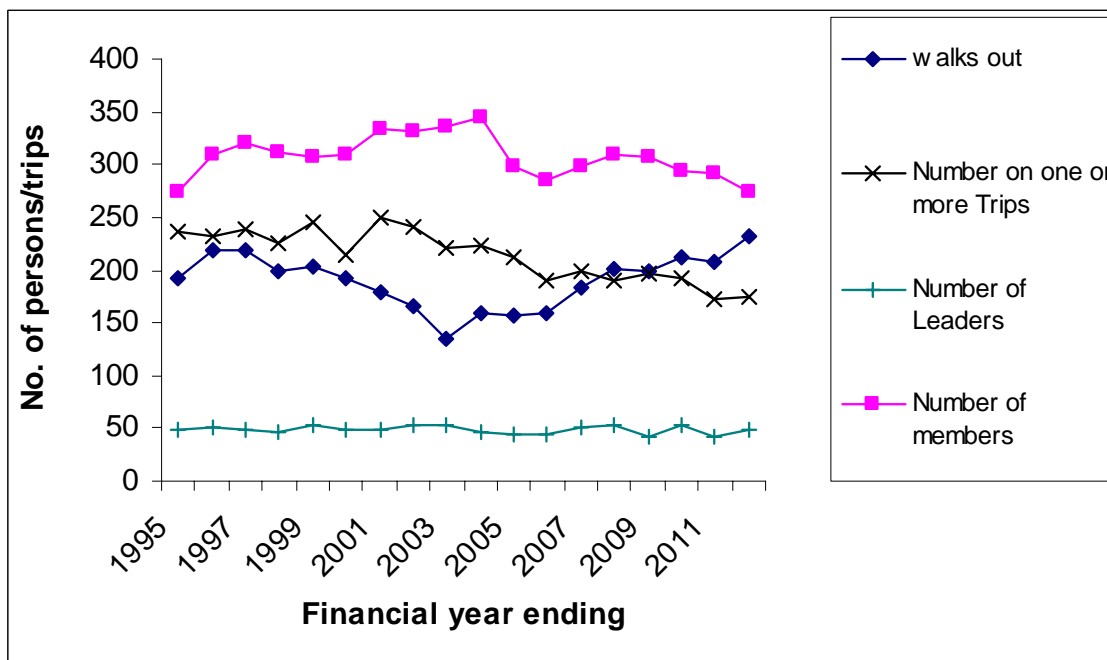
The percentage of members who led trips is well up compared to other years, but still less than 1 in 5. It would be great to see an improvement here.

Last year continued to see an increase in the number of day trips, but no further decrease in weekend trips. The proportion of day walks participation continue to rise at the expense of participation in weekend and extended trips. The percentage weekend participation is now at 54%, the lowest since computer records have been kept.
